A few facilities are able to refuel their own propane cylinders, nevertheless, the majority will have their cylinders refilled in a different place and delivered to their place of work instead. Whenever a lift truck runs out of fuel, the cylinders are changed. Several training and cautions is considered necessary when handling propane in view of the fact that it is a really flammable substance. Directions PPE likewise known as Personal Protective Equipment, should be worn when changing or refilling a lift truck cylinder. The liquid is extremely cold and may result in burning or irritation when it comes into skin contact. At all times wearing thick leather gloves will help protect hands. Goggles or several standard eyewear along with a face shield is also very recommended. Having a fire extinguished nearby is likewise suggested before the refuelling process begins. Make certain the forklift is turned off before beginning and extinguish whatever cigarettes or open flames in the area. Locate the fill valve on the cylinder and take out the protective plastic cover, after that firmly connect the fill line to the fill valve. After the fill line is in place, carefully open the bleed valve. This will be a small round knob on the cylinder which is commonly brass coloured. A hissing sound could escape when the valve is open and this is normal so long as it is only air being vented and not actual propane. Open the valve really gradually on the fill line, listening for whatever leaks. If there are no leaks, then the valve can be safely opened. The sounds of fuel entering the tank should be audible. On no account leave the tank unattended whenever refuelling and look at the bleeder valve throughout the process. A spray of white propane gas would emit from the bleeder valve when the tank is full. Turn the fill valve off completely and next close the bleeder valve. Extremely gradually and cautiously take out the fill line from the tank. Watch for whichever excess gas caught in the coupling that would be expelled when the seal is broken. It must only be a small amount of gas and is normal. Replace the protective cover on the fill valve. Double check all valves are completely closed. The tank is now set and full to use.
